To All Valued JAS Customers:

Please be advised that "Blue World Line" must implement the following General Rate Increase (GRI) for dry and reefer shipments from all Italy ports to the U.S. and Canada effective April 1st, 2022, as a result of recent actions announced by the ocean carriers.
