To All Valued Customers:

Due to market conditions, please be advised that “Blue World Line” must update the previously announced General Rate Increase (GRI) for dry and reefer shipments from all Far East, West Asia (India Subcontinent) and Middle East origins to the U.S. and Canada effective **February 15, 2022**. As a result of recent actions announced by the ocean carriers, we must increase the levels to the following:
